This report summarizes the school counseling services Mrs. Willard provided at Sunset Ridge during the 2014-2015 school year. School counselors focus on the academic, social/emotional and career development of ALL students. The Sunset Ridge Counseling Program is an ASCA Model Program with RAMP Distinction.



School Counselors spend 80% of their time providing Direct Services to students. The other 20% of their time is spent in Indirect Services to their students.


Responsive Services

Students receiving Responsive Services




